



Student finger trapped in an adjustable desk 28 September 2022

OBJECTIVE:

To communicate a safety issue recently identified regarding a student getting their finger trapped in one of the adjustable desks of a Catholic Church Endowment Society (CCES) worksite and provide sites with recommendations to ensure hazards are identified, risks assessed, and effective control measures are developed and implemented.

BACKGROUND:

Recently an incident occurred where a student had their finger trapped in the hole used for adjusting the legs on a school desk. The student had their finger trapped for approximately 15 mins before it was removed with the assistance of dishwashing liquid as a lubricant. The holes on these desks can vary in size from one desk to another depending on the manufacturer.

PREVENTATIVE ACTIONS:

- Before purchasing any school furniture, a pre-purchase risk assessment should be undertaken to determine if this furniture poses any risks or is suitable for the intended use.
- All furniture should be compliant with AS/NZS 4610:2020
- Sites that have these types of desks to assess the risk of entrapment and monitor student interactions with them.
